Why Take the Tests

Many colleges use the SAT Subject Tests for admissions, course placement and for advising students about course selection. Some colleges specify the SAT Subject Tests that they require for admissions or placement, while others allow students to choose which tests to take. Together with other information—high school transcripts, SAT scores, teacher recommendations, etc—the SAT Subject Tests provide another valuable piece of information about a student.

Which Tests to Take

Students should consider

taking SAT Subject Tests in subjects in which they have an interest or excel. They should also find out how the colleges that they're considering use SAT Subject Tests scores. Specifically, students should look to see whether the schools require these scores for admission and, if so, how many tests and in which subjects.

When to Take Them

Most students take SAT Subject Tests toward the end of their junior year or at the beginning of their senior year. It's recommended that students take the SAT Subject

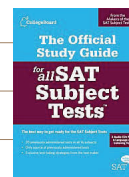
Tests as soon as possible after completing course work for that sub-

ject.

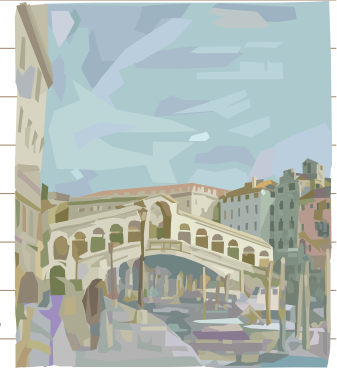

ACT Testing

The ACT is a measure used by many colleges and universities to assess candidates, and is in fact more widely accepted than the SAT. The scoring on the ACT is based on accrued points from correct answers; students are not penalized for incorrect answers (wrong answers on the SAT result in a 1/4 point deduction from the student’s raw score). Reasons to Take the ACT

- Students often score very well on this measure
- The ACT tests students on math, reading, writing, social studies and science rather than math and reading on the SAT I
- Often times a student will not need SAT II scores if they take the ACT with Writing
