MBIT CONSORTIUM AT MIDDLE BUCKS INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY SECONDARY SUMMER SCHOOL
July 6th to July 30, 2010**

The Middle Bucks Institute of Technology Consortium offers *remedial and enrichment* courses for secondary students who will be in grades 7 to 12. For the 2010 Summer School courses can be completed in two ways:

1. **Traditional classroom experience for both remedial and enrichment courses** requiring attendance at MBIT. MBIT is located at 2740 Old York Road, Jamison, Pa between Edison Furlong and Almshouse Road.
 - a. **Remedial courses are designed for students who need to repeat a course not successfully completed during the school year.** These courses are NOT for initial credit.
 - b. **Enrichment courses** are designed for students who need initial credit or for purpose of accelerating their academic placement.
2. **Virtual at home learning using Internet technology for remedial courses only, excluding math and physical education.**

Traditional Classroom Schedule:

1. Remedial students can attend one or two sessions. Sessions are held from 7:30 a.m.-10:40 a.m. or from 11:10 a.m. to 2:20 p.m.
2. Students taking enrichment courses attend class from 7:30 a.m. - 2:20 p.m.
3. Students taking .5 credits in Health and PE may have a flexible time schedule.
4. There will be a break for lunch at 10:10 for enrichment students and at 10:40 for remedial students taking two courses.
5. Students must provide their own lunch.
6. **No transportation is provided.**

Traditional Classroom Expectations:

Students enrolled in Summer School are expected to attend all classes. Credit for Summer School is based upon clock hours and requires **PERFECT ATTENDANCE**. Emergency circumstances may occur that result in school absence. Immediate contact must be made with the summer school office on the day of the absence to communicate the reason for the absence. For an absence to be excused, a student must return from the absence with a signed note from his/her parent/guardian or doctor stating the reason for the absence. At the discretion of the Summer School Director, any student who is absent from three classes in any course, regardless of the reason, will forfeit the course credit and related fees and will be removed from the class. Students who are repeatedly tardy may also be dropped from Summer School classes. Tardiness to class translates into a class absence in accordance with the following:

- > Up to 10 minutes late to class = 1 tardy
- > Up to 20 minutes late to class = 2 tardies
- > Over 20 minutes late to class = 1 absence

Students enrolled in Summer School are expected to attend all classes!

- Students who participate in the Summer School Program are required to follow the MBIT Discipline Code. The Disciplinary Code for MBIT is identical to Consortium Schools Disciplinary codes.
- Disciplinary actions may result in dismissal from Summer School. **No refunds for Summer School following disciplinary action are given.** MBIT and its grounds are smoke free areas. \$50.00 fines will be assessed and students may be dismissed for violations of this policy.

Virtual Learning

1. Students access courses completely over the Internet. No additional course materials are necessary.
2. Students may access the courses at any time through any computer with an Internet connection.
3. Students may enroll in middle level or high school English, Social Studies, and Science.

- If your child has not taken a summer course click on the link on the left column marked New MBIT User sign up.
- If your child has taken summer school courses before, enter your email and password.
- **The parent information is entered first and then the student information. Please make sure you choose the correct school district, school, and email address. Please edit your child's information and your email address.**
- **Enter the MBIT course number and click on the student's name. If you need a second course, repeat the same process.**
- **Checkout by entering your credit card number and clicking on "submit". Payment must be made in full at the time of registration. If you have payment concerns, please contact your school's guidance office.**
- **Mail in registrations for all courses and sessions are also accepted using the attached registration form. This form is also available www.cbconline.com/start_mbit.taf**
- **Courses are offered pending sufficient enrollment and staffing. Notification of course cancellations/changes will be received by July 2, 2010.** If courses are cancelled refunds will be processed and mailed. **No refunds after Friday July 2nd, 2010.**

REMEDIAL COURSES IN A TRADITIONAL CLASSROOM SETTING

- These courses are aligned with the Central Bucks, Council Rock, Centennial and New Hope-Solebury curricula and will focus on key concepts.
- Credit will be awarded for successful completion of the course for students who have previously failed the course.
- These courses are appropriate for students who need to improve their grade in order to move to the next level.
- Tutoring to make up lost time due to a planned vacation is not an option. Fitness classes have flexibility due to hourly/credit requirements.
- Remedial students can attend one or two sessions.
- Report cards for all courses taken in Summer School will be sent to the student's home school with the name of the course that was completed unsuccessfully during the 2009-2010 school term. Science, Social Studies and English courses are generic in nature with emphasis on content, reading, writing, and basic skills within a multi disciplinary approach.
- Rates for students not enrolled in one of the participating consortium schools for all courses will be \$50.00 higher.

REMEDIAL VIRTUAL:

Students may take up to two courses at home using a predetermined, consortium-approved school district curriculum provided by Compass Learning. Completion of virtual courses allows the students to work from their home to complete the required 60 hours of independent study per course. Completion of the course requirements will be monitored virtually by a certified teacher. Course assessments

All courses and assessments must be completed by July 30, 2010.

- Upon completion of either mail in or online registration parents and students will receive log in information and course(s) number. This information will allow you to begin your online instruction.
- **Virtual sign up will end June 7 2010 at 5:00PM.**
- Please do a computer diagnostic test at Compass Learning to make sure your computer is up to date **before** you decide to register your student. Downloading some plug- ins may be required. Consortium Schools will not be able to provide assistance or solve support issues with your computer. Log in issues and problems related to Compass Learning will be resolved by Compass Learning. Your computer must have a sound card and speakers.

ENRICHMENT COURSES

- Enrichment courses are designed for students who need initial credit or for purpose of accelerating their academic placement. Tutoring to make up lost time is not an option. Algebra I is not offered for enrichment. Enrichment courses are offered in Session 3 only. If a block is shaded, that course is not offered for that school district.
- Students from New Hope-Solebury, Council Rock and Centennial who are interested in taking enrichment courses need the prior approval of their guidance counselor or principal.
- These courses are aligned with the Central Bucks, Centennial, Council Rock, and New Hope-Solebury curricula. Credit will be awarded for successful completion of the course per district requirements. Rates will be \$50.00 higher for all courses for students not enrolled in one of the participating consortium schools.
