College Planning— Winter of Your Junior Year

- Make an appointment with your counselor to discuss ways to improve your college preparation and selection processes.
 - Sign up to take the SAT and/or ACT at least once in the spring and again next fall. Register online. Fee waivers are available for students with financial need. To prepare, download practice test booklets from www.collegeboard.com (for the SAT) or from www.ACTstudent.org (for the ACT).
 - Begin a search for financial aid sources. National sources include the College Board Scholarship Handbook and electronic sources. Don't overlook local and state aid sources.
 - Ask a counselor or teacher about taking the SAT Subject Tests in the spring.
- You should take them while course material is still fresh in your mind. You can download "Taking the SAT Subject Tests," which offers test-prep advice, from www.collegeboard.com
- If you're in the Advanced Placement program, register for AP exams by March 25th in the guidance office.
