Ann Silverman Community Health Clinic (Formerly the Free Clinic of Doylestown)

If you are not eligible for one of the Medical Assistance programs but you meet certain income requirements, you may qualify for free medical care, dental care and prescription medications through the Ann Silverman Community Health Clinic. The clinic provides care for eligible patients through the volunteer efforts and financial support of numerous healthcare providers, community members and Doylestown Hospital. Special financing programs, sliding scale fees and charity care may also be available to those who qualify.
